Term 4 in Sophomore English will culminate in the creation of a research project where students will research a social issue of their choosing using the PRESS model for problem solving.

Possible broad topics (we will help students narrow down within broad categories):

- Racism
- Sexism
- Climate Change
- LGBTQ+
- Immigration
- Homelessness/ Poverty

Choose a social issue you care about and brainstorm ideas that you could write about for your research project. You may need to do some preliminary research to complete this assignment.

<ul> <li>Empathy (1-2 paragraphs)</li> <li>Why do you care about this issue?</li> <li>When did you realize you cared about this issue?</li> <li>What personal connections do you have to the topic?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Strategy (1-2 paragraphs)</li> <li>Based on your research in problem awareness and root cause analysis, what are some strategies that our government can use to resolve the issue? (i.e. policies)</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Sacrifice (1 paragraph)</li> <li>Call to action - what can YOU do in your own sphere of influence to work towards resolving the issue? How will you maintain a commitment?</li> </ul>
